

#### From the Pastor:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our season of Easter comes to its conclusion this month as we look ahead to the next celebrations of the church. This isn't to say that we are done with Easter. Far from it! Easter is the basis for all that we do on Sunday. This was the original intent of Christians gathering on Sunday (the *first day* of the week).

Every Sunday was meant to be a mini- Easter: a celebration of the Lord's resurrection and his victory over the grave. Our season of Easter is to remind us that our Lord's resurrection is the basis for all we say and do in the church and even in life. It's the fuel and foundation for our mission as the Church.

Yet, I don't want us to think about the church as any one individual congregation. The Church is the whole of all believers on earth and in heaven. For think about it in these words from St. Paul, "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another," Romans 12:4-5. Each congregation is a member of the larger body, which is meant to function as a whole.

Upcoming this month, we have a unique opportunity to join with the broader Church here in Madison. We, here at St. Paul, will be hosting our first ever Ascension Day service on May 18 in partnership with Immanuel Lutheran Church and Our Savior Deaf Lutheran Church. Our three congregations will join together for this special service that we all may grow together in faith and charity in our mission to the greater Madison community. For the Ascension of our Lord reminds us that Jesus didn't leave us as orphans but continues to rule over our hearts and minds for the good of His Body, the Church. I greatly encourage you to attend this special service.

But our month doesn't end there. Just ten days later, the Church celebrates Pentecost. As Jesus ascends into heaven, he gives his disciples and the Church this promise, that he will send the "Helper" to us. On Pentecost, we celebrate that Jesus does send us a helper, the Holy Spirit to dwell in our hearts and work faith in us that leads to eternal life. For the Holy Spirit will bind together the whole Christian Church on earth by His work.

As Easter gives way to Pentecost and the season of the Church, let us remember always that the Church is not divided by location or language. For the Church is one in Christ. We are members of Christ and his death and resurrection that we may join with the whole Church in the glory of God and life everlasting!
