

#### **SIDEWALK REPAIRS:**

In 2022, the City of Madison ("City") repaired part of the sidewalk by N. Sherman Avenue in front of the church. In November of 2022, the City revised its Policy for the Assessment of Street Improvements. As a result of these revisions, the cost of sidewalk sections that are removed and replaced will not be assessed to the adjacent property.

However, St. Paul Lutheran Church recently received an invoice for \$924.95 from the City for the sidewalk repairs in 2022. We have been advised by the City that we are required to pay this invoice because the repairs to the sidewalk in the front of the church occurred before the City revised its policy. We have the option of paying this invoice in full before 10-31-2023 or in five annual installments. If we pay in installments, we will be charged 2.00% interest.

We would like to pay all, or a large portion, of this invoice before 10-31-2023. If you would like to make a donation specifically for paying for the sidewalk repairs, your donation will be greatly appreciated. You may make a contribution before 10-16-2023 either by marking on your envelope or your check that your contribution is for sidewalk repairs, or by making a payment online through the website www.stpaulmadison.org.



#### **Joint Bible Study**

Immanuel has long held a Wednesday morning Bible study. In light of our budding partnership with St Paul, Monona, and Our Savior Deaf, we would like to invite members from our sister churches to join us.

We start at 9:00am with treats and chit-chat. The Bible study proper starts around 9:30am and goes for an hour. We typically work through a book of the Bible, with occasional detours to discuss the theological implications of current events or questions from the group. At the moment, we are working through the book of James.

The group meets at Immanuel (1021 Spaight St, Madison, WI 53703) downstairs in the lakeview room. Enter the church from Immanuel's side door (look for a mailbox) head down the stairs and hang a right.

Lastly, for those interested we will offer an opportunity to learn some basic sign or even sign up for a sign language class free of charge from Pastor Nowak. Monona Lutheran is now the hub for deaf ministry in Madison for the LC-MS.
