

From the Pastor:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

There is no worse feeling than being left without any options. When there's no other way but the most difficult and the most burdensome path, we begrudgingly trod on through. Indeed, it's wise to try out all our options before taking the hardest road. We often say, "Work smarter, not harder." Perhaps, these other options will work. Or maybe they won't. But when only one path remains, we must come to realize no matter how great our reservations, that is the path we're given.

With Lent beginning this month (February 14), we will see our "options" dwindle. Lent will show us that our road narrows when we follow the Christian life. Sin and evil are no longer options to us when we repent and turn towards God. We will be hearing how God calls us to return to him. "Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love," Joel 2:13. God does not give us many options in how we return. There's one option alone. The road to God is one of repentance and faith.

Consider then the condition of St Paul. It's no secret that we have been experiencing financial woes. It's not for lack of effort to avert or avoid such conditions either. Leadership has worked tirelessly to lessen our financial strain by cutting back on expenses. We have been pursuing our church partnership which in time may yield help with our struggle. However, we must come to the realization that our options are very limited. If St. Paul is to continue, it will take us all working together and walking the hard road alongside one another. We *can* do this! God is not finished with us yet!

Lent may seem like a depressing and uninviting season. I get it. No one likes hearing how horrible and sinful a person they are. Yet, Lent is so much more than this. Lent is a season that calls us to renew our faith in God. Lent is what strips away our idols and sins so that we may rejoice more greatly at Easter. Just as St. Paul records, "For we do not want you to be unaware, brothers, of the affliction we experienced in Asia. For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength that we despaired of life itself. Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death. But that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on God who raises the dead," 2 Corinthians 1:8-9. God limits our options at times to remind us that He alone can save us and raise us from the dead. Such is Lent. It's to renew our focus on our God who shall raise us up to eternal life.

Jesus had only one option. He could not veer off the path set by his Father. Rather, he walks the hard and burdensome road of the cross. By the cross, Jesus dies our death. He pays for our sins. He opens the option for us of faith and eternity! Thus, may we renew our faith this Lent, stripping away our idols, that we may trust fully in God who raises Jesus from the grave and grants to us life everlasting!




